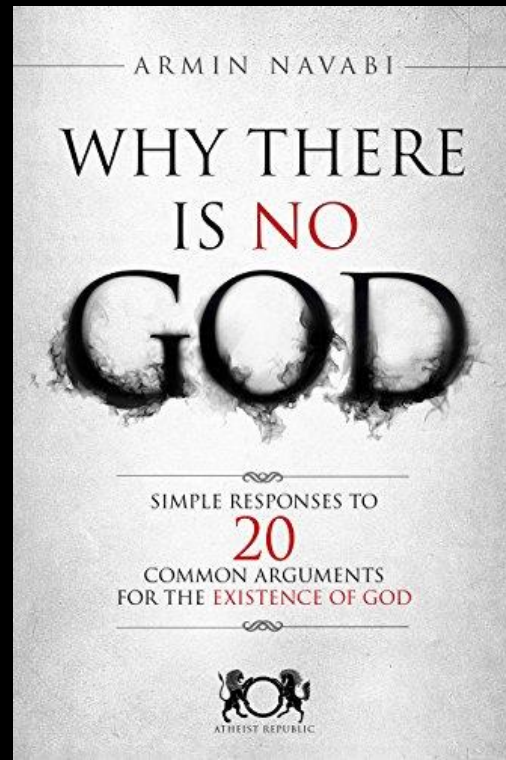
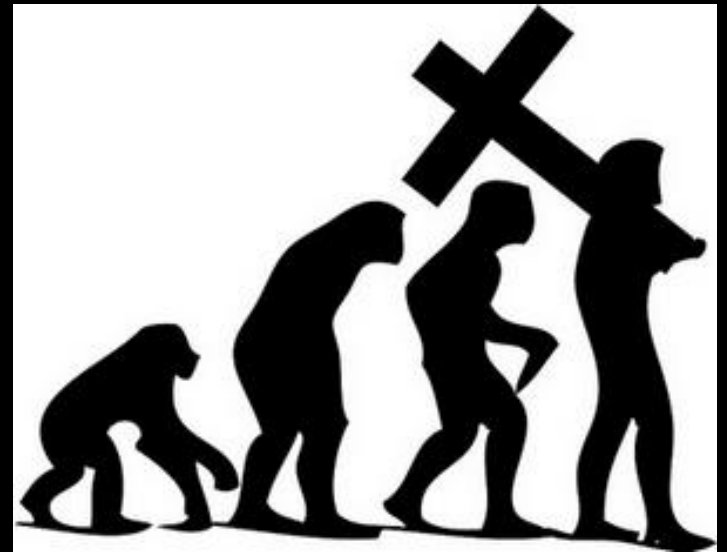

I. The Foolish Man

Psalm 14:1-2

1 The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good.

2 The Lord looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God.

A. The confession of human folly (v 1a)

B. The cause of human folly (v 1b)

C. The completeness of human folly (vv 1c – 2)

II. The Filthy Man

Psalm 14:3-4

3 They are all gone aside, they are all together become filthy: there is none that doeth good, no, not one.

4 Have all the workers of iniquity no knowledge? who eat up my people as they eat bread, and call not upon the Lord.

A. Man's impurity (v 3)

B. Man's impiety (v 4)

Psalm 53:5

**Every one of them is
gone back: they are
altogether become
filthy; there is none
that doeth good, no,
not one.**

III. The Fearful Man

Psalm 14:5-6

5 There were they in great fear: for God is in the generation of the righteous.

6 Ye have shamed the counsel of the poor, because the Lord is his refuge.

A. Suddenly confronted by God (v 5)

B. Suddnely convicted by God (v 6)

IV. The Faithful Man

Psalm 14:7

Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion! when the Lord bringeth back the captivity of his people, Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad.

A. His longing

B. His laughter
