- 2 Blessed is the man unto whom the LORD imputeth not iniquity, and in whose spirit there is no guile.
- **3** When I kept silence, my bones waxed old through my roaring all the day long.
- 4 For day and night thy hand was heavy upon me: my moisture is turned into the drought of summer. Selah. 5 I acknowledge my sin unto thee, and mine iniquity have I not hid. I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the LORD; and thou forgavest the iniquity of my sin. Selah.

 - 2. Willful violation of moral integrity should bring deep remorse

I. You May Feel Guilty Because You Are Guilty A. David felt guilty because of his sins (vv 3-4) **B.** We are all guilty before God **Romans 3:19** Now we know that what things soever the law saith, it saith to them who are under the law: that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God.

James 2:10

For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all. I. You May Feel Guilty Because You Are Guilty C. We've been weighed and found guilty even when we think we are innocent



Job 31:6

Let me be weighed in an even balance that God may know mine integrity.

D. Guilt feelings can have a positive effect
Psalm 51:3
For I acknowledge my transgressions: and my sin is ever before me.

- A. How David felt before confessing his sins and receiving forgiveness (vv 3-4)
 - 1. He felt older than his years
 - 2. He felt as though God was against him
 - **3.** He felt as though he was in a spiritual desert

B. Forgiveness was available to David, but he had not accepted it

1. The Lord's invites us to be forgiven

Isaiah 1:16

Wash you, make you clean; put away the evil of your doings from before mine eyes; cease to do evil;

2. The Lord paid for our sins

Isaiah 53:5-6

5 But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.
6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.

B. Forgiveness was available to David, but he had not accepted it - continued

3. The Lord guarantees forgiveness

Hebrews 7:25-28

25 Wherefore he is able also to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by him, seeing he ever liveth to make intercession for them.
26 For such an high priest became us, who is holy,

harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners, and made higher than the heavens;

B. Forgiveness was available to David, but he had not accepted it - continued

3. The Lord guarantees forgiveness

Hebrews 7:25-28

27 Who needeth not daily, as those high priests, to offer up sacrifice, first for his own sins, and then for the people's: for this he did once, when he offered up himself. 28 For the law maketh men high priests which have infirmity; but the word of the oath, which was since the law, maketh the Son, who is consecrated for evermore.

Psalm 103:3
Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thy diseases;

4. Heaven celebrates forgiveness

Luke 15:7

I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance.

4. Heaven celebrates forgiveness

Revelation 5:9-10

9 And they sung a new song, saying, Thou art worthy to take the book, and to open the seals thereof: for thou wast slain, and hast redeemed us to God by thy blood out of every kindred, and tongue, and people, and nation; 10 And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth.

Our forgiveness depends on accepting God's gracious offer to sinners

Even grace does not force forgiveness on us

III. You Can Be Free From Guilt By Accepting Forgiveness

A. David finally sought and found forgiveness (v 5)

B. Sins confessed are sins forgiven1 John 1:9If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

III. You Can Be Free From Guilt By Accepting Forgiveness

- C. Sins forgiven are sins forgotten Hebrews 8:12
- For I will be merciful to their unrighteousness, and their sins and their iniquities will I remember no more.
- **Hebrews 10:17**
- And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more.
