# DIRECTION AND DESTINATION

PSALM 73:22-25

#### Psalm 73:22-26

- 22 So foolish was I, and ignorant: I was as a beast before thee.
- 23 Nevertheless I am continually with thee: thou hast holden me by my right hand.
- 24 Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel, and afterward receive me to glory.
- 25 Whom have I in heaven but thee? and there is none upon earth that I desire beside thee.
- 26 My flesh and my heart faileth: but God is the strength of my heart, and my portion for ever.

#### Introduction

- A. Two important questions must be considered
  - 1. What shall I do with my life?
  - 2. Where will I go after life is past?
- B. The Psalmist has found the answers
  - 1. His Lord will guide him through life
  - 2. Afterward, he would be received to glory

## How Can We Have The Psalmist's Assurance?

- A. The psalmist had foolishly focused on other's faults
- 1. He had envied the prosperity of the wicked Psalm 73:3-5
- 3 For I was envious at the foolish, when I saw the prosperity of the wicked.
- 4 For there are no bands in their death: but their strength is firm.
- 5 They are not in trouble as other men; neither are they plagued like other men.

- A. The psalmist had foolishly focused on other's faults (continued)
- 2. He grieved over his pain and their "blessings" Psalm 73:11-14
- 11 And they say, How doth God know? and is there knowledge in the most High?
- 12 Behold, these are the ungodly, who prosper in the world; they increase in riches.
- 13 Verily I have cleansed my heart in vain, and washed my hands in innocency.
- 14 For all the day long have I been plagued, and chastened every morning.

- B. Finally, he faced up to his own sins
- 1. He went to the sanctuary and looked to God Psalm 73:16-21
- 16 When I thought to know this, it was too painful for me;
- 17 Until I went into the sanctuary of God; then understood I their end.

- B. Finally, he faced up to his own sins
- 1. He went to the sanctuary and looked to God Psalm 73:16-21 continued
- 18 Surely thou didst set them in slippery places: thou castedst them down into destruction.
- 19 How are they brought into desolation, as in a moment! they are utterly consumed with terrors.
- 20 As a dream when one awaketh; so, O Lord, when thou awakest, thou shalt despise their image.
- 21 Thus my heart was grieved, and I was pricked in my reins

- B. Finally, he faced up to his own sins continued 2. In looking to God, we see our need of Him
- **Psalm 5:3**

My voice shalt thou hear in the morning, O LORD; in the morning will I direct my prayer unto thee, and will look up.

#### **Psalm 5:7-8**

- 7 But as for me, I will come into thy house in the multitude of thy mercy: and in thy fear will I worship toward thy holy temple.
- 8 Lead me, O LORD, in thy righteousness because of mine enemies; make thy way straight before my face.

C. We are all sinners in need of salvation Romans 3:19

Now we know that what things soever the law saith, it saith to them who are under the law: that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become guilty before God.

## II. We Must Grateful For God's Guidance (vv 22-23)

- A. The presence of God is greater than the pleasures of the world
  - 1. He is continually with us

**Psalm 46:1** 

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

2. He gives confidence to us

**Proverbs 14:26** 

In the fear of the Lord is strong confidence: and his children shall have a place of refuge.

## II. We Must Grateful For God's Guidance (vv 23-24)

- A. The presence of God is greater than the pleasures of the world
- 3. Our choice needs to be His presence

**Hebrews 11:25** 

Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season;

B. We can live constantly in the knowledge of God's presence

**Matthew 28:20** 

Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen.

#### Hebrews 13:5

Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.

## II. We Must Grateful For God's Guidance (vv 23-24)

- C. God's guidance is given to those who trust Him
  - 1. "Thou shall guide me with thy counsel"
  - 2. The guidance of God determines the direction of our lives

**Psalm 31:3** 

For thou art my rock and my fortress; therefore for thy name's sake lead me, and guide me.

### III. We Must Grasp The Guarantee Of Glory (vv 24-25)

"And afterward receive me to glory"

- A. The assurance heaven was ahead
- B. The ability to look beyond the problems Romans 8:18
