THE IMPORTANCE OF PERSONAL FRITH

LUKE (B:35-43)

Luke 18:35-43

- 35 And it came to pass, that as he was come nigh unto Jericho, a certain blind man sat by the way side begging: 36 And hearing the multitude pass by, he asked what it meant.
- 37 And they told him, that Jesus of Nazareth passeth by. 38 And he cried, saying, Jesus, thou son of David, have
- mercy on me.
- 39 And they which went before rebuked him, that he should hold his peace: but he cried so much the more, Thou son of David, have mercy on me.

Luke 18:35-43 - continued

- 40 And Jesus stood, and commanded him to be brought unto him: and when he was come near, he asked him, 41 Saying, What wilt thou that I shall do unto thee? And he said, Lord, that I may receive my sight.
- 42 And Jesus said unto him, Receive thy sight: thy faith hath saved thee.
- 43 And immediately he received his sight, and followed him, glorifying God: and all the people, when they saw it, gave praise unto God.

A. Faith is needed to please God

Hebrews 11:6

But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

Colossians 1:10

That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God;

- B. Faith must be perfected in us
- 2 Peter 1:5-10
- 5 And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge;
- 6 And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness;
- 7 And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity.

- B. Faith must be perfected in us
- 2 Peter 1:5-10 continued
- 8 For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 9 But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins.
- 10 Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:

C. Faith must be personal to us (v 32)

Luke 7:50

And he said to the woman, Thy faith hath saved thee; go in peace.

I. Personal Faith Is A Recognizing Faith (18:35)

- A. He recognized that he was a blind man
 - 1. Living in darkness
- 1 John 1:6

If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth:

- 2. Not living in deafness
- B. He recognized that he was a begging man
 - 1. He begged the multitude for silver
 - 2. He begged the Master for sight
 - a. He got natural sight!
 - b. He got spiritual sight!

II. Personal Faith Is A Responsive Faith (18:35-37)

- A. He responded to the Hope
 - 1. When Jesus is around, there is hope

Psalm 78:7

That they might set their hope in God, and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments:

2. When Jesus is attentive, there is hope

Mark 10:49

And Jesus stood still, and commanded him to be called. And they call the blind man, saying unto him, Be of good comfort, rise; he calleth thee.

Psalm 103:14a
He knoweth our frame...

II. Personal Faith Is A Responsive Faith (18:35-37)

- B. He responded to the Help
 - 1. Respond to the Savior when He passes by
- 2. Respond to the Spirit when He passes by Psalm 119:77
- Let thy tender mercies come unto me, that I may live: for thy law is my delight.

III. Personal Faith Is A Revealing Faith (18:38)

- A. He knew he had to reveal the Nazarene
 - 1. The Lord is revealed
 - 2. The lineage is revealed
- 1 John 2:23

Whosoever denieth the Son, the same hath not the Father: he that acknowledgeth the Son hath the Father also.

III. Personal Faith Is A Revealing Faith (18:38)

B. He knew he had to reveal his need

- 1. He needed the Master
- 2. He needed His mercy

Isaiah 55:7

Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the LORD, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

IV. Personal Faith Is A Rebuked Faith (18:39)

- A. The world will rebuke and reject your faith
 - 1. Personal faith causes differences
- 2 Corinthians 6:17

Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean thing; and I will receive you.

- 2. Personal faith causes departure
- 1 Peter 2:11

Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul;

IV. Personal Faith Is A Rebuked Faith (18:39)

- B. The wicked will rebuke and reject your faith
 - 1. Run when the wicked rebukes your faith
- 1 Peter 4:4
- Wherein they think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot, speaking evil of you:
- 2. Rejoice when the wicked rebukes your faith Matthew 5:11-12
- 11 Blessed are ye, when men shall revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.
- 12 Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.

IV. Personal Faith Is A Rebuked Faith (18:39)

- C. The worshippers will rebuke and reject your faith John 9:27-28
- 27 He answered them, I have told you already, and ye did not hear: wherefore would ye hear it again? will ye also be his disciples?
- 28 Then they reviled him, and said, Thou art his disciple; but we are Moses' disciples.
- **2 Timothy 3:5**
- Having a form of godliness, but denying the power thereof: from such turn away.

V. Personal Faith Is A Requesting Faith (18:39, 41)

A. He requested the Savior

Isaiah 66:2

For all those things hath mine hand made, and all those things have been, saith the LORD: but to this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at my word.

Matthew 7:7

Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you:

V. Personal Faith Is A Requesting Faith (18:39, 41)

B. He requested his sight John 14:13-14

13 And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son.
14 If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it.

Are you doing the requesting, or is your faith doing the requesting?

VI. Personal Faith Is A Receiving Faith (18:42-43)

- A. He received the sight of seeing the Savior 1 Corinthians 13:12
- For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known.

Isaiah 55:6

Seek ye the LORD while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near:

VI. Personal Faith Is A Receiving Faith (18:42-43)

- B. He received the sight of seeing salvation Luke 2:29-30
- 29 Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word:
- 30 For mine eyes have seen thy salvation,

Is your personal faith large enough that it is a receiving faith?

VII. Personal Faith Is A Rejoicing Faith (18:43)

- A. His rejoicing faith caused him to follow the Lord...
 - 1. Because he has discovered His love
- 1 John 4:16

And we have known and believed the love that God hath to us. God is love; and he that dwelleth in love dwelleth in God, and God in him.

2. In continuing love

John 15:9

As the Father hath loved me, so have I loved you: continue ye in my love.

VII. Personal Faith Is A Rejoicing Faith (18:43)

- B. His rejoicing faith caused him to praise
 - 1. Blessing the Savior
 - 2. Bolstering the saints
- Psalm 103:1-2
- 1 Bless the LORD, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless his holy name.
- 2 Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits:
