The Journey Of Forgiveness

Luke 15:15-24

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- 11 And he said, A certain man had two sons:
- 12 And the younger of them said to his father, Father, give me the portion of goods that falleth to me. And he divided unto them his living.
- 13 And not many days after the younger son gathered all together, and took his journey into a far country, and there wasted his substance with riotous living.
- 14 And when he had spent all, there arose a mighty famine in that land; and he began to be in want.
- 15 And he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country; and he sent him into his fields to feed swine.

Luke 15:15-24 - Continued

- 16 And he would fain have filled his belly with the husks that the swine did eat: and no man gave unto him.

 17 And when he came to himself, he said, How many hired servants of my father's have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger!
- 18 I will arise and go to my father, and will say unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and before thee, 19 And am no more worthy to be called thy son: make me as one of thy hired servants.

Luke 15:15-24 - Continued

- 20 And he arose, and came to his father. But when he was yet a great way off, his father saw him, and had compassion, and ran, and fell on his neck, and kissed him. 21 And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son.
- 22 But the father said to his servants, Bring forth the best robe, and put it on him; and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet:
- 23 And bring hither the fatted calf, and kill it; and let us eat, and be merry:
- 24 For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found. And they began to be merry.

I. Recognizing the Need for Forgiveness

- A. Recognize our own need for forgiveness
 - 1. We need understanding
- Psalm 14:2-3
- 2 The LORD looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God.
- 3 They are all gone aside, they are all together become filthy: there is none that doeth good, no, not one.
 - 2. We need agreement (v 17)

I. Recognizing the Need for Forgiveness

- B. Recognize the impact of not forgiving
 - 1. Our instruction
- **Matthew 6:12-13**
- 12 And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.
- 13 And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.
 - 2. Our ignorance
- Matthew 6:14-15
- 14 For if ye forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you:
- 15 But if ye forgive not men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

I. Recognizing the Need for Forgiveness

- C. Recognize God's call to forgive
 - 1. Repentance required
- **Luke 17:3**
- Take heed to yourselves: If thy brother trespass against thee, rebuke him; and if he repent, forgive him.
 - 2. Relationship reflected
- Ephesians 4:32
- And be ye kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you.

II. Releasing The Burden Of Unforgiveness

- A. Release bitterness and anger
 - 1. No good for you
- Ephesians 4:31
- Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice:
 - 2. No good for God
- **James 1:20**
- For the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God.

II. Releasing The Burden Of Unforgiveness

- B. Release the desire for revenge
- **Romans 12:19**
- Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.
- C. Release control of the past
- Isaiah 43:18-19
- 18 Remember ye not the former things, neither consider the things of old.
- 19 Behold, I will do a new thing; now it shall spring forth; shall ye not know it? I will even make a way in the wilderness, and rivers in the desert.

III. Rebuilding Relationships Through Forgiveness

A. Rebuild trust

Galatians 6:1

Brethren, if a man be overtaken in a fault, ye which are spiritual, restore such an one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted.

B. Rekindle love and compassion

Colossians 3:12

Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering;

C. Rejoice in reconciliation (vv 22-24)

Luke 15:32

It was meet that we should make merry, and be glad: for this thy brother was dead, and is alive again; and was lost, and is found.
