# THE UNMENTIONABLES

LUKE 1918-27

#### Luke 19:13-27

13 And he called his ten servants, and delivered them ten pounds, and said unto them, Occupy till I come. 14 But his citizens hated him, and sent a message after him, saying, We will not have this man to reign over us. 15 And it came to pass, that when he was returned, having received the kingdom, then he commanded these servants to be called unto him, to whom he had given the money, that he might know how much every man had gained by trading.

### Luke 19:13-27 - continued

- 16 Then came the first, saying, Lord, thy pound hath gained ten pounds.
- 17 And he said unto him, Well, thou good servant: because thou hast been faithful in a very little, have thou authority over ten cities.
- 18 And the second came, saying, Lord, thy pound hath gained five pounds.
- 19 And he said likewise to him, Be thou also over five cities.

#### **Luke 19:13-27 - continued**

- 20 And another came, saying, Lord, behold, here is thy pound, which I have kept laid up in a napkin:
- 21 For I feared thee, because thou art an austere man: thou takest up that thou layedst not down, and reapest that thou didst not sow.
- 22 And he saith unto him, Out of thine own mouth will I judge thee, thou wicked servant. Thou knewest that I was an austere man, taking up that I laid not down, and reaping that I did not sow:
- 23 Wherefore then gavest not thou my money into the bank, that at my coming I might have required mine own with usury?

#### Luke 19:13-27 - continued

- 24 And he said unto them that stood by, Take from him the pound, and give it to him that hath ten pounds.
- 25 (And they said unto him, Lord, he hath ten pounds.)
- 26 For I say unto you, That unto every one which hath shall be given; and from him that hath not, even that he hath shall be taken away from him.
- 27 But those mine enemies, which would not that I should reign over them, bring hither, and slay them before me.

#### Introduction

- A. The gift of God to his servants
- **Ephesians 4:7**
- But unto every one of us is given grace according to the measure of the gift of Christ.
- B. The command of God to His servants Occupy – "to carry on the business"
- **Romans 12:11**
- Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord;

- C. The reward of God to the faithful Revelation 22:12
- And, behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be.
- D. The judgement of God to the faithless
  - 1. An improper view of God
  - 2. An insufficient action for God

## I. Play It Safe

A. Avoids the bad

Luke 18:11-12

11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican.

12 I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess.

## I. Play It Safe

B. Avoids the best Job 1:8

And the LORD said unto Satan, Hast thou considered my servant Job, that there is none like him in the earth, a perfect and an upright man, one that feareth God, and escheweth evil?

## I. Play It Safe

C. Avoids exercising faith

Psalm 107:23-24

23 They that go down to the sea in ships, that do business in great waters;

24 These see the works of the LORD, and his wonders in the deep.

Hebrews 11:6

But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

## II. Play It Short

- A. Do not realize the command and fall short in spiritual purpose
- Matthew 25:44-47
- 44 Therefore be ye also ready: for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh.
- 45 Who then is a faithful and wise servant, whom his lord hath made ruler over his household, to give them meat in due season?
- 46 Blessed is that servant, whom his lord when he cometh shall find so doing.
- 47 Verily I say unto you, That he shall make him ruler over all his goods.

## II. Play It Short

- B. Do not realize the commitment and fall short of our spiritual potential
- 2 Peter 2:5-8
- 5 And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge;
- 6 And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness;
- 7 And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity.
- 8 For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

## III. Play It Silent

- A. Work requires words
- Acts 18:8-10
- 8 And Crispus, the chief ruler of the synagogue, believed
- on the Lord with all his house; and many of the
- Corinthians hearing believed, and were baptized.
- 9 Then spake the Lord to Paul in the night by a vision, Be
- not afraid, but speak, and hold not thy peace:
- 10 For I am with thee, and no man shall set on thee to hurt
- thee: for I have much people in this city.

## III. Play It Silent

#### B. Words require worth

Matthew 12:36-37

36 But I say unto you, That every idle word that men shall speak, they shall give account thereof in the day of judgment.

37 For by thy words thou shalt be justified, and by thy words thou shalt be condemned.

#### **Matthew 10:32**

Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven.
