Biblical Prayer





Luke 18:1-14

- 1 And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint;
- 2 Saying, There was in a city a judge, which feared not God, neither regarded man:
- 3 And there was a widow in that city; and she came unto him, saying, Avenge me of mine adversary.
- 4 And he would not for a while: but afterward he said within himself, Though I fear not God, nor regard man;5 Yet because this widow troubleth me, I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me.

Luke 18:1-14 - continued

6 And the Lord said, Hear what the unjust judge saith.7 And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them?8 I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?

Luke 18:1-14 - continued

9 And he spake this parable unto certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others:10 Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican.

11 The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God,

I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican.

12 I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess.

Luke 18:1-14 - continued

13 And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner.

14 I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted.

I. Humble Yourself Before God in Prayer

- A. Prayer requires humility and recognition of our dependence on God
- James 4:6
- But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble.

I. Humble Yourself Before God in Prayer

- **B. Humble prayer acknowledges God's greatness and our need for His help**
- **Psalm 95:6-7**
- 6 O come, let us worship and bow down: let us kneel before the Lord our maker.
- 7 For he is our God; and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.
 - A Adoration C – Confession T – Thanksgiving S - Supplication

I. Humble Yourself Before God in Prayer

- C. Humility in prayer leads to God's favor2 Chronicles 7:14
- If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land.
- Lamentations 3:40-41
- 40 Let us search and try our ways, and turn again to the LORD.
- 41 Let us lift up our heart with our hands unto God in the heavens.

II. Persistent Prayer Brings Results

- A. We are called to pray incessantly 1 Thessalonians 5:17 Pray without ceasing.
- **1 Timothy 2:8**
- I will therefore that men pray every where, lifting up holy hands, without wrath and doubting.

II. Persistent Prayer Brings Results

- **B.** Persistence in prayer demonstrates faith and trust in God's timing
- Luke 18:1
- And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint.
- Jonah 2:7
- When my soul fainted within me I remembered the LORD: and my prayer came in unto thee, into thine holy temple.

II. Persistent Prayer Brings Results

C. God rewards persistent and fervent prayer 1. That is effectual by the faithful

James 5:16

Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

2. That is enjoined with faith

Hebrews 11:6

But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

III. Pray With Faith And Expectation

- A. Expect God to answer your prayers Mark 11:24
- Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them.

III. Pray With Faith And Expectation

- **B. Faith-filled prayer moves mountains** Matthew 17:20
- And Jesus said unto them, Because of your unbelief: for verily I say unto you, If ye have faith as a grain of mustard seed, ye shall say unto this mountain, Remove hence to yonder place; and it shall remove; and nothing shall be impossible unto you.

III. Pray With Faith And Expectation

- C. Pray believing that God is able to do the impossible Luke 1:37
- For with God nothing shall be impossible.
